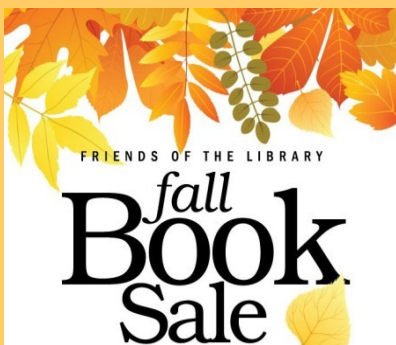
Bare Bones Trombone Quartet in Concert

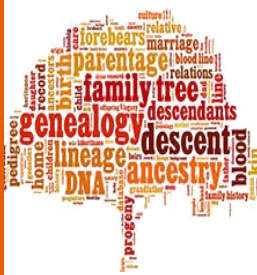

Genealogy Group

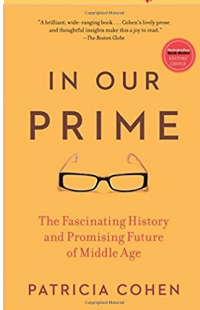
