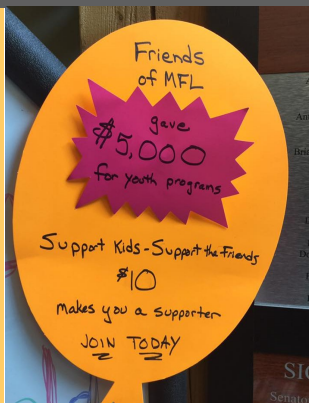
Dick Ward in Concert

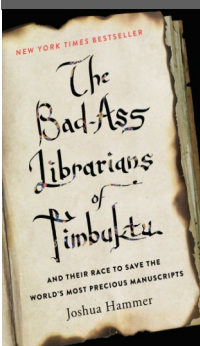

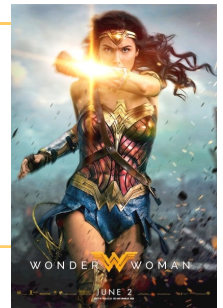

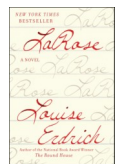
