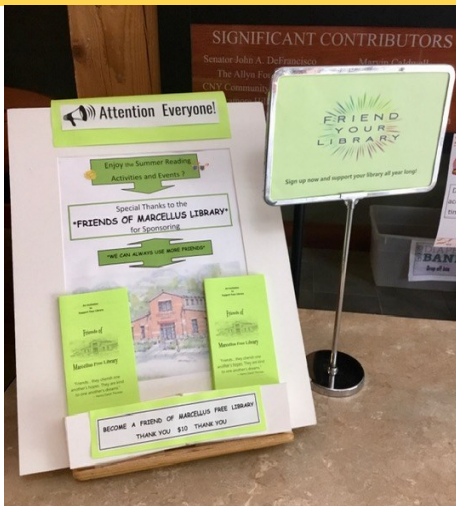
First meeting: Thursday, October 21 at 4:00 pm

Unfortunately, due to the lack of storage space, the Friends are currently unable to accept book and media donations.

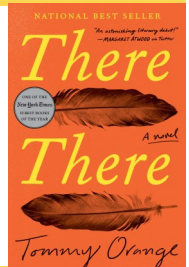

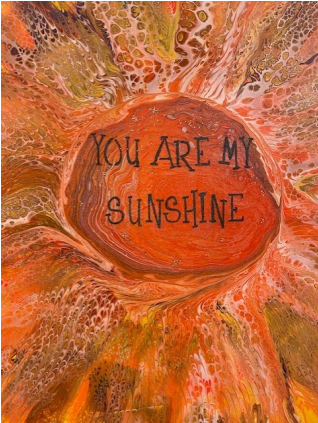
